NARRATIVE: The undersigned has probable cause to believe the above-named defendant on the 15 of February 2016 at 10:00 at 2707 WILLOW RUN BOULEVARD (Zone: b-4) in Orange County did

Commit the above listed offenses.

On 2/15/16, at approximately 1504 hours, the Orlando Police Department (O.P.D.) Communications Center received a 911 call regarding a possible human placenta found in the parking lot of the Willow Bend Apartments, 4757 Silver Star Road (Orlando, Orange County, Florida). Orlando Police Officers Sergio Ramos and Samuel Jones responded to the scene, arriving at approximately 1510 hours. They were directed to the placenta, which was in a pool of apparent blood in the parking lot on the west side of building 4757. The scene was secured and marked with yellow crime scene tape.

At approximately 1610 hours, I, Detective Chris Haas, was on duty with the Homicide Unit when I was notified of the above incident. It was requested I respond to assist with the investigation. Detective Mike Stanley was also assigned to assist. Crime Scene Investigator (CSI) Gary Crosby responded for photos and evidence collection.

At approximately 1700 hours, Detective Stanley and I arrived on scene. CSI Crosby arrived a few minutes later. Sergeant Dan Brady, the Homicide Unit supervisor, was notified and also responded. We all examined the placenta, which still had part of the umbilical cord attached. A photo of the placenta was sent to the District Nine Medical Examiner's Office and they confirmed it appeared to be a later term human placenta.

At our request, members of the Search and Rescue of Central Florida responded to the scene with a team of dogs to conduct an extensive area search for a baby. As Detective Stanley and I continued our investigation, the dog search and rescue team, along with several patrol officers, spent hours searching the surrounding area. These search efforts continued late into the night, all with negative results. The Willow Bends Apartments were canvassed and residents were interviewed, but nobody was able to provide any further information.

There were several shoe impressions in apparent blood evidence leading away from the placenta in a northwest direction through the parking lot, followed by several additional drops of blood. It appeared the person who left the placenta ended up with blood on their shoes and briefly tracked it through the parking lot. Assisting officers located additional drops of blood on the front porch of 2707 Willow Run Boulevard, which is located within the next building to the north of where the placenta was found.

We spoke with several neighbors of 2707 Willow Run Boulevard who confirmed there was a pregnant black female who lived there. We were consistently told how the female's pregnancy appeared to be nearly full term. A police database check of that address revealed the current resident to be Johnnie L. Bryant (B/M - DOB: 11/10/54). We knocked on the door and announced our presence for several minutes, but nobody answered. At that point, we requested additional officers to secure the residence for further investigation.

The O.P.D. Communications Center checked with the Orlando Fire Department (O.F.D.) and found out they were called to 2707 Willow Run Boulevard at approximately 1205 hours that day regarding a female who claimed to have had a miscarriage. Rural Metro Ambulance also responded and transported the victim to Florida South hospital. She was identified as Susan S. Richardson (B/F - DOB: 10/19/85). Detective Stanley and I drove to Florida South hospital, but were told Richardson had already been released. She apparently told hospital staff she was only three to four months pregnant and had a miscarriage. She did not mention anything to the hospital about recently giving birth.

As Detective Stanley and I were leaving the hospital, Sergeant Brady advised me that Johnnie Bryant had just returned home. He confirmed he lives at 2707 Willow Run Boulevard with Richardson and that she was just released from Florida South for a possible miscarriage. Detective Stanley and I returned to the residence to meet with Bryant. Just as we were arriving, Richardson returned home. I asked her speak with us on scene in my unmarked police vehicle, and she agreed.

It was apparent throughout the interview that Richardson was not concerned about her baby's well-being. At times she would yawn when asked a question, and other times she would lean her head back as if she was bored with our questions. The only concern she demonstrated during the entire interview was whether or not she was going to be arrested. Richardson was not willing to provide any information to help us locate her newborn baby.

After the interview, Bryant and Richardson both gave us written consent to search their residence for photos and evidence collection. We found obvious blood evidence in Richardson's bedroom, in the bathroom, and in the laundry room in the back patio of the house. After searching the residence, we also requested a dog from Search and Rescue of Central Florida do conduct a scent search of the residence, but no additional evidence was located. We noted how there were no diapers, baby carriages, cribs, or any other items in the residence to show Richardson was preparing for the caretaking of a newborn baby.

At the time of this report, the Orlando Police Department has not received any phone calls or anonymous tips regarding a newborn child being left on a doorstep anywhere city wide, and the current whereabouts of Richardson's child still unknown.

Based on the above facts and sworn testimony, probable cause has been established to charge Susan Richardson with Child Neglect and Unlawful Desertion of a Child in violation of F.S.S.'s 827.03 and 827.10.

We are respectfully requesting that the Court retain the defendant on a no bond status until the whereabouts and well-being of the child can be determined.
