Circumstances Surrounding Death

On February 12, 2014, Tariji's body was found in a suitcase that had been buried in Putnam County, Florida. At the time of her death, Tariji was in the legal custody of her mother, Rachel Fryer, pursuant to a court ordered reunification which occurred on November 17, 2013. Tariji's siblings, also resided in the home. All four children were receiving post placement supervision services at the time. Direct in-home case management services, as well as in home family support services were being provided.

One day prior to the discovery of Tariji's body, Rachel Fryer was arrested for Aggravated Child Neglect as Tariji's whereabouts were allegedly unknown. The autopsy results released on February 26th indicated that Tariji died of blunt force trauma to the head.

On February 11, 2014, Rachel Fryer was arrested and charged with Aggravated Child Neglect, First Degree Murder, Tamper with Evidence, and Mishandle Dead Human Body Remains. As of this writing, she is being held without bond in the Seminole County Jail.

Rachel Fryer was interviewed by the Sanford Police Department and provided the following details surrounding Tariji's death.

On the morning of February 6, 2014, the mother went to wake up Tariji, and had already left for school. The mother found Tariji unresponsive. The mother stated Tariji took a deep breath and exhaled, but showed no other signs of life. The mother attempted to revive Tariji by conducting Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation and applying Tariji's breathing treatments for her asthma. She attempted to revive Tariji for approximately thirty minutes before ceasing her efforts. During her efforts to resuscitate a pinkish fluid came out of Tariji's nose.

After ceasing her efforts to revive Tariji, the mother wrapped the child in a blanket/comforter and placed her in a chair in one of the bedrooms. The mother stated she did not attempt to contact Emergency Medical Services or 911.

On February 6, 2014, at approximately 3:00 p.m. Rachel Fryer placed Tariji in a suitcase. The mother contacted a friend for a ride to Crescent City. The friend dropped off the mother with the suitcase containing the body of Tariji in Crescent City. The mother walked to an address of a home in Crescent City. The mother then removed Tariji from the suitcase and buried her body near the house. The mother slept on the porch attached to the home that night. On February 7, 2014 at approximately 11:00 a.m. the mother's friend picked her up and they returned to Sanford. The mother left the other children at home with a friend while she was in Crescent City.

Law Enforcement subsequently responded to the scene in Putnam County and discovered Tariji Gordon's body where Rachel Fryer had indicated it was left.

The Child Protection Team completed interviews and examinations of disclosed their mother hit Tariji with a brown stick, a broom handle, a mop, and flip flops on a regular basis due to Tariji always being "bad". disclosed the last beating to Tariji by their mother was on February 5, 2014. The father, Timothy Gordon Jr. admitted to being in and out of the home prior to the child's death, although he was not supposed to be per the Dependency case. Concerns noted in the CPT reports that the father had spanked Tariji when he was in the home.

It was determined by the Medical Examiner that Tariji was beaten, bashed in the face multiple times, her upper and lower frenulum were torn, she had bruising across her forehead, cigarette burns on the palms of her hands, part of her hair was removed, she had bald spots, she was wearing a wig, she had suffered an acute subdural hemorrhage, her brain had swelled, and she passed away as a result.
